**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 127-58B OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF
SECAUCUS ENTITLED "DESIGNATION OF LOCATIONS AT OR NEAR PRIVATE
RESIDENCES"**

SECTION 1

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus that Section 127-58B - "Designations of Locations at or Near Private Residences" shall be amended by adding the following location:

NAME OF STREET SIDE LOCATION

Koelle Boulevard East On the east side of Koelle Boulevard, beginning at a point 178 feet north of the northeast corner of Koelle Boulevard and Huber Street continuing for a distance of 22 feet directly in front of 1030 Koelle Boulevard.

SECTION 2

That the space designated for 1030 Koelle Boulevard adopted by Ordinance is to be personalized for Placard No. P828912.

If the license plate for the person utilizing the parking space at the above listed address changes, then the parking space designation (s) shall be changed to the new plate with proof from the resident that it is for the same person that the person is still entitled to handicapped parking.

SECTION 3

SEVERABILITY

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the provisions of this ordinance are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words or parts of the regulation or their application to other persons or circumstances.

It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included herein, and if such persons or circumstances, to which this ordinance or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempted therefrom.

SECTION 4

REPEALER

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 5

EFFECTIVE DATE

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS FOR MUNICIPAL, TAXES, FEES AND COSTS AND MUNICIPAL COURT FINES AND COSTS

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services has adopted regulations authorizing municipalities to accept credit card and electronic payments in accordance with the procedures and protocols set forth in NJAC 5:30-9.1; and

WHEREAS, in order for a municipality to accept credit card and electronic payments, a resolution must be adopted by the governing body authorizing the same and further stating the types of obligations which may be paid by electronic receipt and the types of electronic receipts that will be permitted; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Town of Secaucus to authorize the payment of the following types of obligations, to wit:

- a. Municipal Taxes;
- b. Municipal Water charges;
- c. Municipal Sewer charges;
- d. Municipal Court fees, costs and fines;
- e. Bail
- f. Fines and penalties imposed by various inspections agencies, officers and agencies of the municipality;
- g. Recreation fees and charges;
- h. Application fees;
- i. Permit fees and costs;
- j. Escrow depositions made in connection with land use applications; and
- k. All other taxes, rates, fees, charges, costs and impositions associated with the operation of the municipality

WHEREAS, the Town by enactment of this Resolution shall authorize the Tax Collector, Municipal Court Administrator, Police Chief, Recreation Director, Zoning and Planning Officer, Construction Code Official and Town Clerk to accept payment by credit card or other electronic payment means and methods for any fees, taxes, costs, penalties, bail or other payments associated with the operation of their respective departments; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance credit card and electronic payments is governed by the provisions of NJAC 5:30-9.1 et. seq., as pertaining to the operation of Municipal Government; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of credit card and electronic payments is governed by the Rules of Court and directives issued by the Supreme Court of New Jersey and the Administrative Office of the Courts as related to the operations of the Municipal Court of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. Governing Body of the Town of Secaucus does hereby authorize and empower the Tax Collector,
2. That the use of credit cards payments by the municipality shall comply in all respects with the requirements of NJAC 5:30-9.1 et seq.; and
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately and the Chief Financial Officer of the Municipality shall implement all internal accounting and control procedures required by NJAC 5:30-9.1 et seq; and
4. The award of all contracts for credit card services shall comply with the requirements of NJSA 40:11-1 et seq., to the extent applicable and the requirements of NJAC 5:30-9.1 et. seq.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Jeffas reported that the Fire Department is having a Fire Service Day on May 18, 2008 in the center of Town. He also reported on the Television Committee and continues to try to get a meeting together to discuss what he has learned so far. He said that he hopes that will occur between now and the next meeting.

Councilman Reilly reported that over the last several weeks there has been discussion by residents regarding police regulations and traffic and how they have not been looked at closely. He reported, per the Police Chief, the amount of citations issued for various violations. He said that the police are out there addressing the speeding problems in various locations.

Councilman Gonnelli asked the Mayor to appoint chairmen for each committee so that meetings can be called.

Mayor Elwell said that there is a Flood Committee meeting tomorrow and a chairman will be appointed then.

Councilman Gonnelli pointed out that the Mayor says that he will appoint someone at each meeting, but has yet to do so.

Mayor Elwell appointed Paul Hugerich chairman of the Shade Tree Committee.

Councilman Gonnelli stated that there are other committees. He recommended that there be a personnel committee and noted that the Administrator is the one doing all the recommendations and interviewing. He stated that it would be a good idea to get a Councilman involved in the process.

May 13, 2008

Mayor Elwell said it will be considered in Caucus. He stated that the next meeting the Caucus will be held at 4:30.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Councilman Gonnelli reported on one speed bump on Radio Avenue and asked when the second one will be placed.

Mayor Elwell explained that there was some confusion and said that he would further discuss it in Caucus. He said that he sent the directions to the DPW from the Police Department with exact directions.

Councilman Gonnelli stated that the bump at the corner of Meadow and Mill Ridge has been removed, and asked, per residents that it be replaced. He said that on Koelle Blvd., people are avoiding the speed bump and cutting through Blondel and Gillis.

Mayor Elwell said that he spoke with the Police Chief and it was said that people will cut around the bumps and go on side streets. He said that someone was following him, when they got to the speed bump, they went to the right, therefore only creating one bounce. He said that there are complaints on Sixth Street also. He said that the conversation with the Police brings recommendations of the placement of the speed bumps. He said that he has asked the Chief to put some personnel to patrol the speeding. Conversation continued on the speeding problem.

Councilman Gonnelli asked Councilman Reilly if there was an update on the traffic condition at Best Buy.

Councilman Reilly stated that there is still dialogue between the County and the State. He said that there is an officer there to help with traffic. He explained the problem between the County and the State and how Secaucus is not able to do much to correct the problem.

Councilman Gonnelli stated that it is the timing of the light.

Councilman Reilly explained that it is up to the State to reset the timing.

Mayor Elwell stated that there has been discussion with the County and will follow up on it.

Councilman Gonnelli asked Mr. Drumeler, Town Administrator, about a letter regarding outstanding projects. He said some have been completed and some have not and there are chronic problems. He continued to explain the problems he was referring to.

Mayor Elwell explained some of the upcoming work that is to be done.

Councilman Gonnelli continued speaking about other projects that need to be addressed. He spoke about the Seniors regarding on line shopping and asked that it be coordinated with Senior Services.

Mayor Elwell said that it will be part of the job of the new person that is hired for the Senior Center as well as the Senior Services at each senior building.

Councilman Gonnelli proposed that there be a budget work shop.

Mr. Drumeler agreed.

Councilman Gonnelli motioned to have the Mayor and Council hold one additional Caucus Meeting per month, seconded by Councilman Jeffas.

Councilman Bueckner stated that he agreed with Councilman Gonnelli as far as the lack of time to discuss issues prior to the public hearing. He spoke about a handicapped parking issue and feels that was necessary to discuss instead of other issues that are not as important. He said that he feels that meeting at 5:30 is not enough time and gave suggestions of other options.

Councilman Reilly agreed and noted that sometimes the problem lies with the Council themselves with veering off the agenda. He made some suggestions to correct the problem.

Councilman Bueckner noted that he does ask a lot of questions at the Caucus Meeting and stated that he will continue to do so, as he feels that it is important to do.

Councilman Jeffas noted that during the last few Caucus' he had a few issues he wanted to discuss and time ran out.

Councilman Shinnick agreed with Councilman Reilly and he explained his view of the issue.

Councilman Kane spoke about monitoring the time and expressed his opinion of the issue.

Mayor Elwell gave his view on the issue. He explained why some of the meetings run long and some of the issues that are discussed and reported on. He said there will be 4:30 Caucus Meeting at the next regularly schedule date and stated that he will bring his gavel for the purpose of keeping order. He suggested using the phone to do some preliminary discussion.

Councilman Gonnelli stated that he does call the Administrator, but thinks that as a whole governing body, there needs to be discussion.

He noted a meeting at the Senior building regarding the supermarket problem. He said that a resident called him and he was able to get to that meeting. He said there was a meeting at Clarendon School regarding Damascus Bakery that he found out about through his son and also received a call from a resident. He asked again that they be kept in the loop.

Mayor Elwell addressed each issue and explained his reason for the meetings. He explained what transpired at the meeting and stated that he is entitled to call meetings.

Councilman Kane explained that he was asked not to attend the meeting so that it would not seem political.

Mayor Elwell said that Mr. Prieto wanted to address the problem. He explained that the Council was not invited.

Councilman Jeffas said that he feels that it would be best to be informed.

Discussion continued.

Councilman Gonnelli voiced his opinion on the issue. He spoke about the dedication of the Duck Pond to former Mayor Just and the fact that he was unaware of that event until the day before.

Mayor Elwell explained that this was discussed in Caucus.

Councilman Gonnelli continued the discussion on communication among the Council.

Discussion continued.

Councilman Bueckner spoke about property on Keiswetter Lane and the project being built there.

Mayor Elwell explained the problem there and that there will be a Flood Committee Meeting to discuss it.

Councilman Bueckner asked for follow up after the meeting.

Mayor Elwell agreed.

Councilman Bueckner spoke about the budget and ask for a copy of projected spending.

Mayor Elwell stated that there has been a request for work sessions, and said that when Mrs. Barkala is ready, there will be Saturday work sessions with Department Heads.

Councilman Gonnelli stated that Mr. Anthony Iacono gave it out.

Mayor Elwell said that he did not know who gave it out and he did not see it.

Councilman Shinnick asked what that statement was based on and discussed giving statements at a public meeting.

Mayor Elwell spoke about the meeting at Clarendon School and said that Councilman Gonnelli's position on the issue. He asked Councilman Gonnelli about the method of voting while on the NJMC.

Councilman Gonnelli explained how he believes the voting works.
