BEVERAGE, SOUP and SAUCE CARTONS



COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS AND TUBES

ARE RECYCLABLE AND NEED TO BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY!

DO NOT RECYCLE:

NO FROZEN FOODS OR FOOD CONTAMINATED PIZZA BOXES, FOOD CONTAINERS, OR FOOD-CONTAMINATED FOIL ITEMS



NO CERAMIC MUGS, VASES, BAKEWARE, GLASSWARE, DISHES OR WINDOW GLASS



NO MOTOR OIL, ANTIFREEZE, LUBRICANTS, OIL-BASED PAINT OR PESTICIDE CONTAINERS



NO 'OLD STYLE' INCANDESCENT OR LED LIGHT BULBS



NO PLASTIC BAGS



They jam up our sorting equipment. Recycle them at grocery stores instead.

PUT RECYCLING CURBSIDE BY 6 AM

PAPER BROWN BAG IT BUNDLE IT • BOX IT • OR USE TOWN SUPPLIED RECYCLING RECEPTACLES

Use cardboard or rigid box (laundry basket or milk crate)

CARDBOARD PLEASE FLATTEN BIG BOXES REMOVE STYROFOAM, PLASTIC AND WOOD

GLASS and PLASTIC BOTTLES METAL and ALUMINUM CANS BEVERAGE, SOUP and SAUCE CARTONS

PLEASE RINSE- LABELS ARE OK

DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS TO RECYCLE PAPER

NEVER PUT PAPER IN PLASTIC BAGS

REMEMBER ONE TRUCK COLLECTS PAPER- ANOTHER COLLECTS BOTTLES & CANS

RECYCLING DATES FOR PAPER, CARDBOARD, BOTTLES & CANS

Please see below for collection schedule and leaf pickup

MIXED PAPER

Mixed paper, which includes just about all types of paper, such as newspaper, magazines, junk mail, stationery, copy paper, food/cereal boxes, computer paper, phone books, and cardboard are picked up every week. They should be placed in a paper bag, cardboard box or tied up (bundles should be no higher than 12 inches and tied with string twine only.) **DO NOT** put mixed paper out in plastic bags.

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

If your garbage is collected on Monday/Thursday, your recycling collection is Thursday.

If your garbage is collected on Tuesday/Friday, your recycling collection is Tuesday.

LEAVES

Leaves are collected every Wednesday from September 1 through December 31. They should be bagged in paper or Biodegradable Bags **ONLY** and placed at curb side on Tuesday evenings.

TREE PARTS

Tree parts are collected every Wednesday. A pickup may be scheduled by calling the DPW at 201 330-2080.

CHRISTMAS TREES

Christmas trees (with all ornaments, tinsel, etc. removed) are collected from January 1 through January 31. Please place them at curb side on your regular garbage day.

USED MOTOR OIL, SPENT OIL FILTERS, ANTIFREEZE & OIL BASED PAINT

Containers are available for used motor oil, spent oil filters and antifreeze and oil-based paint at the new DPW compound located at 370 Secaucus Road. Residents may recycle at this location from 6:30am-2:30pm 7 days a week.

Please call 201 330 2080 before bringing items to the yard.

RECYCLING CONTAINERS

Residents who need a recycling container should call DPW at 201 330-2080.

ELECTRONIC WASTE

For large electronic waste (TV's, computers, printers) call DPW 201 330-2080 to schedule a pick-up. OR see below for our BIG GREEN BOXES for small electronic items-(cell phones, chargers, batteries, etc.)

WHITE GOODS

White goods include refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, furnaces, stoves, ranges, hot water heaters, air conditioners, trash compactors and dishwashers. A pickup may be scheduled by calling DPW at 201 330-2080.

BULK RUBBISH

Bulk rubbish includes large items such as furniture and waste from construction, remodeling, repair and demolition operations, **ONLY** when the homeowners do their own renovations (NO CONTRACTORS). For a fee, homeowners can rent a roll-off container. Call DPW at 201 330-2080 to schedule a pickup of demolition debris or to rent a container.

COMMERCIAL COLLECTION

WASTE PAPER

Commercial establishments may **NOT** dispose of waste paper products with regular garbage. The following materials are collected: junk mail, white paper, copy paper, ledger paper, envelopes, magazines, waste paper and paperback catalogs. **DO NOT** include paper cups, paper plates, napkins, carbon paper, telephone books, plastic wrap, food wrap or plastic bags.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard is also collected from businesses by prearrangement with the DPW. Cardboard should be flattened and tied with string in bundles approximately 3 ft. x 3 ft. x 1 ft. thick. **DO NOT** include plastic or wax coated boxes, food boxes or gift boxes. Please make certain that all cardboard is free of food waste and other debris before placing at the curb.

Waste paper and corrugated cardboard are collected from businesses every **WEDNESDAY**. Pickup must be scheduled in advance with the DPW. Call 201 330-2080.
