ORDINANCE NO. 2024-15

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 127 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF
SECAUCUS ENTITLED “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC” TO UPDATE A PARKING
LOCATION WHERE TIME IS RESTRICTED**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that the safety of all motorists, passengers, pedestrians, children, residents and visitors is of utmost importance; and

WHEREAS, the Town enacted §127-1 et seq. to assist in alleviating dangerous situations on the Town’s streets, promote safe passage, address traffic flow and parking, and specify penalties for violations; and

WHEREAS, upon the review and recommendation of the Secaucus Police Department’s Traffic Division, the Mayor and Council have determined an update is needed for the location of Paterson Plank Road and Fairview Avenue, which is in a high residential and traffic area to aid in resident and public safety and decrease parking congestion for residents, business owners and the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The following change shall be made to §127-24 “Schedule II: No Parking Certain Hours” of the Code of the Town of Secaucus and the following location shall be deemed no parking during certain hours under § 127-8. Chapter 127 be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (deletions are indicated by ~~crossouts~~; additions are indicated in **bold**):

2. There are no other changes to this Chapter of the Code of the Town of Secaucus.
3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
4. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.
5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED, that the remainder of this Chapter 127 of the Code of the Town of Secaucus shall remain in full force and effect.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-16

BOND ORDINANCE TO MAKE VARIOUS AMENDMENTS TO BOND ORDINANCE (ORD. NO. 2021-23) ENTITLED: "BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$9,644,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE TOWN RESERVE FUNDS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS," ADOPTED AUGUST 24, 2021.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The title of Ordinance No. 2021-23 originally entitled:

"BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$9,644,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE TOWN RESERVE FUNDS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS"

adopted by the Town Council of the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the "Town") on August 24, 2021 (the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended to: (A) decrease the appropriation from \$9,644,000 to \$7,844,000 (a decrease of \$1,800,000); and (B) delete the appropriation of Town Reserve Funds as a source of funding for the ordinance, and shall hereafter read as follows:

"BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$7,844,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS."

Section 2. Section 2 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to delete the appropriation of Town Reserve Funds as a source of funding for the ordinance, and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds

authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited."

Section 3. Section 4 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to: (A)(i) decrease the appropriation and estimated cost in Section 4.H. from \$7,817,670 to \$6,017,670 (a decrease of \$1,800,000); and (ii) delete the \$1,800,000 appropriation of Town Reserve Funds as a source of funding; and (B)(i) decrease the aggregate appropriation and estimated cost for Section 4 from \$9,644,000 to \$7,844,000 (a decrease of \$1,800,000); and (ii) delete the \$1,800,000 appropriation of Town Reserve Funds as a source of funding; and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each

such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

2. There are no other changes to this Chapter of the Code of the Town of Secaucus.

3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
4. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.
5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED, that the remainder of this Chapter 127 of the Code of the Town of Secaucus shall remain in full force and effect.

2. Sidewalk Slabs shall be removed at an expansion joint or cut at a control joint. Sidewalks shall be poured 4" thick over 4" of Dense Graded Aggregate with appropriate expansion and control joints as specified in the NJDOT Standard Specifications.
3. All 9' x 18" curb forms shall be fully formed on both sides. Face forming curbs is not an acceptable method. 9" x 18" vertical curbing shall be installed at the driveway apron with a 1-1/2" reveal. Form work must be approved by the Secaucus Engineering Department prior to any concrete pours.



SECTION 1 -SCOPE OF WORK, PRICE, AND TAXES. PSEG shall perform the services, as set forth in the Form of Proposal (the "Services") for the price specified therein. Any terms or conditions other than those stated in the Street and Area Lighting Services Agreement shall be null and void, including any preprinted terms and conditions contained in any of the Customer's purchase order forms. Customer shall be responsible for and shall pay the amount of any tax applicable to the Services. Except in cases of emergency, no extra or different Services shall be done unless written approval is issued authorizing such Services prior to the performance thereof. Any extra or different work performed by PSEG on an emergency basis shall be governed by the terms and conditions which incorporates by reference the provisions of PSEG's Tariff for Electric Service.

SECTION 2 - TERMS OF PAYMENT. Monthly payment for the Services shall be included in Customer's bill. Upfront payments for the Services as identified in the Form of Proposal is required before the start of work, unless otherwise indicated.

SECTION 2a – TERM OF AGREEMENT. Please reference the Lighting Rate Schedule section of the Tariff regarding provisions for:

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SECTION 3 - WARRANTY AND REMEDIES

A. PSEG warrants that for the period of twelve (12) months after the completion of the Services, the Services will reflect competent professional knowledge, judgment and workmanship and will be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional standards and work practices applicable at the time the Services are performed. PSEG warrants that any goods (e.g. lights, brackets and poles) installed shall be free from defects in material or workmanship for one year from the date of installation or provision, whichever occurs first.

B. PSEG does not warrant and shall have no liability for any nonconformance or defects in the performance of the finish on painted street lighting equipment. Customer shall pursue all claims for nonconformance or defects in the performance of the finish on painted street lighting equipment against the manufacturer and PSEG shall take commercially reasonable efforts to support and assist Customer.

C. Conditions Applying to Warranties.

1. PSEG shall have no liability or obligation for any manufacturing, construction or design defects in the Customer's facilities and equipment, hidden hazardous conditions, or the Customer's failure to comply with all applicable codes, standards, laws, and regulations.

2. Customer shall provide PSEG with any pertinent facts or information concerning the Customer's facilities and equipment which could affect the Services to be performed therein which are known or accessible only to the Customer or not reasonably discoverable by PSEG.

3. Customer will provide written notice to PSEG specifying nonconforming Services or Goods upon discovery thereof, and in any event, any such notice of warranty nonconformance shall be given no later than forty-five (45) days after the expiration of the applicable warranty period.

4. Customer will provide PSEG with a reasonable opportunity to perform corrective work to comply with warranties herein. All corrective work will be performed on a schedule to be mutually agreed upon. Customer shall be responsible to remove and replace any equipment or structure in order to provide PSEG with access to perform warranty work.

5. PSEG shall have no liability or obligation for anything arising out of these terms, in the event that the Customer breaches any of the requirements of Paragraph C of this Article.

D. **Exclusivity of Warranties and Remedies.** The warranties set forth in these terms are exclusive and are in lieu of all other warranties, whether statutory, express or implied, including, but not limited to, any warranties or merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose or arising out of any course of dealing or usage of trade. The remedies set forth in these terms are the exclusive remedies of Customer for any breach, defect or anything arising out of the performance or nonperformance of these terms.

SECTION 4 - INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY

PSEG shall indemnify and hold Customer harmless for any claims, suits, costs, damages, losses, or judgments arising out of PSEG's negligent acts or omissions in connection with these terms. Customer shall indemnify and hold PSEG harmless for any claims, suits, costs, damages, losses, or judgments arising out of Customer's negligent acts or omissions in connection with these terms. However, the parties' entire liability and obligation under these terms shall not exceed the dollar amount of the Contract Price, as set forth in "Form of Proposal", and under no circumstances shall the parties be liable to each other for any special, incidental, indirect, punitive, or consequential losses or damages whatsoever (including for lost profits, time, or revenue) for anything arising out of the performance or nonperformance of these terms, whether claims for said losses or damages are premised on warranty, negligence, strict liability, contract, or otherwise.

SECTION 5 - DELAYS AND FORCE MAJEURE. Other than the obligation to pay money, the parties shall not be liable to each other for failure to perform or for delay in performance due to, any cause beyond their reasonable control: or fire; flood, strike, or other labor difficulty; acts of God; mandates, directives, orders, or restraints of any governmental, regulatory, or judicial body or agency; riot; embargo; fuel or energy shortage; delays in transportation; inability to obtain necessary labor, materials or manufacturing facilities from usual sources; or act of omission of any of the persons or entities employed by the parties. 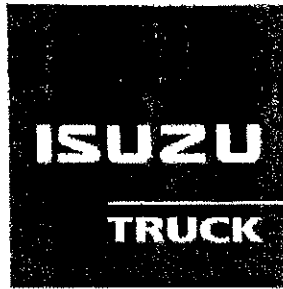
