

## RECYCLE THESE ITEMS:

### CARDBOARD & MIXED PAPER

Including: newspaper, magazines, "junk mail," paper bags, gray paperboard (such as cereal boxes), & office paper



### METAL CANS & ALUMINUM

Please rinse empty



### GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

Please rinse empty



### PLASTICS

Check the number plastic on the bottom & remove caps.



### BEVERAGE/SOUP/SAUCE CARTONS

Please rinse empty



Condominium and garden apartment dwellers should speak with their management company or superintendent for recycling locations.

### MIXED PAPER

BROWN BAG IT • BUNDLE IT • BOX IT • OR USE TOWN SUPPLIED RECYCLING RECEPTACLES

**CARDBOARD** • FLATTEN BOXES  
**REMOVE ANY STYROFOAM & PLASTIC**

### BOTTLES/CANS

PLACE LOOSE IN TOWN SUPPLIED RECYCLING RECEPTACLES • **DO NOT BAG**

### COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS & TUBES ARE RECYCLABLE & NEED TO BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY!

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) cannot  
be put with regular trash or recycling.  
This includes fluorescent bulbs & tubes,  
propane tanks, fire extinguishers, etc. For a full

## RECYCLING INSTRUCTIONS

### RECYCLING CONTAINERS

Residents who need a recycling container should call the DPW.

### COLLECTION SCHEDULE

If your garbage is collected on Monday/Thursday, your recycling collection is **Thursday**.  
If your garbage is collected on Tuesday/Friday, your recycling collection is **Tuesday**.

### TREE PARTS

Tree parts are collected every Wednesday. A pickup may be scheduled by calling the DPW.

### LEAVES & YARDWASTE

Leaves are collected every Wednesday from September 1 - December 31. They should be bagged in paper **BIODEGRADABLE BAGS ONLY** (available FREE for Secaucus residents only from the DPW) and placed at curb side on Tuesday evenings.

### CHRISTMASTREES

Christmas trees (with all ornaments, tinsel, etc. removed) are collected from January 1 - January 31. Place at curb side on your regular garbage day.

### HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE (HHW)

HHW are items found in our homes, garages & sheds that are dangerous to our environment and cannot be disposed of in regular garbage collection. Residents can call the DPW to schedule a drop-off time at the Secaucus DPW compound for **propane tanks, used motor oil, antifreeze, & oil-based paint**. *Latex paint no longer contains dangerous chemicals, so it can be dried out with absorbent material and discarded with regular trash.* FOR ALL OTHER HHW MATERIALS (such as pesticides, herbicides, corrosives, thinners, pool chemicals, car batteries, solvents, cleaners, formaldehyde, fire extinguishers, etc.), they must be brought to a Hudson County Improvement Authority HHW collection day. ### ELECTRONIC WASTE

For large electronic waste (TV's, computers, printers, etc.) call DPW to schedule a pick-up.

For small electronic items (cell phones, chargers, batteries, etc.) see below for our BIG GREEN BOXES.

### WHITE GOODS

White goods include refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, furnaces, ranges, hot water heaters, air conditioners, trash compactors, dishwashers & stoves. A pickup may be scheduled by calling DPW. ### BULK RUBBISH

Bulk rubbish includes large items such as furniture & waste from construction, remodeling, repair & demolition operations, ONLY when homeowners do their own renovations (no contractors). For a fee, homeowners can rent a roll-off container. Call DPW to schedule a pickup or to rent a container.

### DONATE

Before contacting the DPW for any pickup, please consider donating your household items if they are in a suitable or working condition.
