A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ALLOWING ELECTRIC VEHICLES TO BE BONDED FOR IN NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, currently, NJSA 40A:2-1 prohibits municipal governments from paying for passenger vehicles through capital funds, requiring that they be purchased through current fund accounts paid for entirely in the year they are purchased (rather than years used); and

WHEREAS, this rule creates an unintended financial incentive for local governments to purchase SUVs instead of passenger vehicles; and

WHEREAS, In 2018, many municipalities are interested in purchasing fully electric plug-in vehicles for the benefits of future maintenance cost savings as well as the significant carbon emission reduction and other environmental improvements; and

WHEREAS, Because of the current local finance rules, municipalities who want to purchase fully electric plug-in vehicles are currently forced to do so through their current fund, even though a) many of these vehicles have a warranty longer than five years of useful life, b) putting the cost on the year one taxpayer for longer term equipment is often too burdensome, and c) no fully electric plug-in SUVs are manufactured in the United States; and

WHEREAS, A technical change in the finance regulations for local governments, such as the bill that has been sponsored by Assemblyman McKeon (A4424/S3025), would permit local governments to put fully electric plug-in passenger vehicles in capital budget accounts, thereby incentivizing local governments to purchase cleaner and in the long-term, cheaper, electric passenger vehicles for a number of uses; and

WHEREAS, it is possible that such an influx of capital to the electric vehicle market could help more broadly spur electric vehicle innovation and accelerate the development and manufacturing of more, better, and cheaper electric vehicles and ultimately contribute to environmental improvements around New Jersey and nationwide, as well as help accelerate an industry which could create more jobs in New Jersey and in the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, that the Town hereby supports Assemblyman McKeon and the New Jersey Legislature for considering such an important local issue, and with the passage of this resolution do formalize their support for this bill and the benefits it would bring to the Town of Secaucus and New Jersey taxpayers
