NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Town Council, Council of Hudson, State of New Jersey, hereby resolve and agree to adopt the following procedures regarding public comments during remote public meetings of the Town Council:

- 1. Public comments for a remote public meeting shall be in accordance with Resolution 2021-13 and may be made during the designated public comment portion of the meeting or submitted in writing to the Secaucus Town Clerk's Office no later than 4:00pm on the date of the public meeting. Written public comments must be e-mailed to the Town Clerk's Office at <u>mmarra@secaucus.net</u> or mailed to the Secaucus Town Clerk's Office at 1203 Paterson Plank Road, Secaucus, NJ 07094. Written public comments regarding a specific agenda item that is scheduled for public hearing (such as an ordinance or resolution), should designate the agenda item to which their comment applies.
- 2. Written public comments submitted via e-mail or mail must include identifying information, as the Town reserves the right to verify the submitter's identity. Each comment shall be read from the beginning until the time limit is reached at the end of the public comment portion of the meeting.
- 3. Written public comments containing profanity or vulgarity will not be read into the record. The clerk or presiding council member reserves the right to read

similar or duplicative comments with the content summarized and will do so for all similar/duplicative comments.

- 4. The procedures and requirements for making public comments during a remote meeting, along with an explanation of the audio muting function of the electronic communications platform being used, shall be announced at the beginning of the remote public meeting.
- 5. Regulation of conduct by members of the public on a remote public meeting shall be consistent with law and practices followed if a member of the public disrupts an in-person meeting. The following procedures shall be incorporated:

The local public body shall facilitate a dialogue with the commenter to the extent permitted by the electronic communications technology;

If a member of the public becomes disruptive during a remote public meeting, including during any period for public comment, the member of the local public body charged with running the remote public meeting shall mute or continue muting, or direct appropriate staff to mute or continue muting, the disruptive member of the public and warn that continued disruption may result in their being prevented from speaking during the remote public meeting or removed from the remote public meeting. Disruptive conduct includes sustained inappropriate behaviors, such as, but not necessarily limited to, shouting, interruption, and use of profanity; and

A member of the public who continues to act in a disruptive manner after receiving an initial warning may be muted while other members of the public are allowed to proceed with their questions or comments. If time permits, the disruptive individual shall be allowed to speak after all other members of the public have been given the opportunity to make their comment. Should the person remain disruptive, the individual may be muted or kept on mute for the remainder of the remote public meeting, or removed from the remote public meeting.

- 6. The clerk and/or presiding council member of the remote meeting shall reserve the right to take necessary action to protect the rights of the public to participate in the remote public meeting.
- 7. Executive/closed session shall only be accessed by individuals participating in the session and a non-public line or platform may be utilized.
