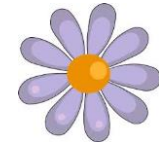




April 2018 Senior Citizen Newsletter

Easter - celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead, and is Christianity's most important holiday. It has been called a moveable feast because it doesn't fall on a set date every year, as most holidays do. Instead, Christian churches in the West celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the full moon after the vernal equinox on March 21. Therefore, Easter is observed anywhere between March 22 and April 25 every year.

Passover - One of the Jewish religion's most sacred and widely observed holidays, Passover commemorates the story of the Israelites' departure from ancient Egypt, which appears in the Hebrew Bible's books of Exodus, Numbers and Deuteronomy, among other texts. Jews observe the weeklong festival with a number of important rituals, including traditional Passover meal known as a seder, the

removal of leavened products from their home, the substitution of matzo for bread and the retelling of the exodus tale.
